Easing the burden for young adult cancer survivors pursuing parenthood by providing financial support for fertility treatments, adoption, and surrogacy.

THE NEED

- 90,000 young adults (ages 15-39) are diagnosed with cancer each year (ACS).
- They're likely to face cancer-related infertility which is generally NOT covered by insurance.
- There's a \$100,000 difference in the net worth of young adult cancer survivors compared with their healthy counterparts (2018 Sam Fund).



Worth the Wait paid over \$110,000 in grants in 2023. Funds were paid directly to fertility clinics, adoption agencies, labs, and storage facilities on behalf of young adult cancer patients/survivors pursuing parenthood.
